## Annex

Q. Subject access request has been around since the Data Protection Act, so why don't you hold records from when the 100,000 Genomes Project started?

A. Genomics England has not maintained these records prior to June 2018. Genomics England takes its responsibilities on data minimisation very seriously. As a result where requests have been completed and archived records may be put beyond use.

Q. Please check the individual subject access requests to see if the request was for WGS data. If this isn't possible can you let me know why not? Please refer to ICO guidance on extracting information.

Genomics England have identified 17 subject access requests that have referred to WGS data.

Q. Do you have any information e.g internal guidance, briefings relating to the costs in releasing VCF data?

No. The cost of releasing VCF data has not been calculated.
